1. Approval of the agenda	Approved	
2. Report from Nursery and Primary Educational Council (24/10/2017)	Prevention of psychosocial issues and possible school problems for nursery pupils including speech therapist and psychomotor examination in November. The objective is to putting in place appropriate help for the pupils.	
	Sexual education – for P5 and S3 will be carried out by the external company AXADO (in French and English only), no participation of the class teachers.	
	Teaching of music in ES section – external teacher was used; however school does not approve it as it is responsibility of the school.	
	Extra budgetary funds from the purchase of the agenda, gym clothes, vending machines, etc. – school wants to use these extra funds for the investment into the education. Plan is to be invested for teaching of music, investment into the ICT. Will be raised in the Board meeting to discuss with the school how to decide/distribute the money for the various projects (similar to the Springfest Committee).	CA members – discuss the issue of extra budgetary funds at the Board meeting
	European hours – no concrete projects presented on the meeting.	
	Transition P5-S1 as regards Language 2 – no follow-up for the moment, will be discussed in January 2017. The same problem was raised also for the math.	ES – to follow-up the transition for L2 between



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	September 2018 (for classes from S2 – S5). Focus on key competencies. It means that the current S5 and S6 are last classes which will have BAC according to the old scheme. The current S5 and S6 shall not be forgotten. There is also need to discuss new BAC with the universities across the Europe. Sections are invited to discuss new marking scheme with the national inspectors. Usage of SMS – secondary teachers are obliged to use SMS (grades, info on projects, clear information about timing of exams, etc.). New parents format meeting – only meeting with class teachers all at the same time for S1 –

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	between the sections and overcrowding – it is very important issues for the school management.	
5. Enrolments	New enrolment policy for the school year 2018/19 drafted by the Central Enrolment Authority (valid for all EU schools). No impact on priority pupils (siblings) who are already in the school, main impact on "newcomer" pupils. No impact on secondary students.	
	Change that the "satellite" classes can be created in the Berkendael for all language sections (i.e. not only EN, FR and DE sections). The objective is to fill the Berkendael and reduce overcrowding in the existing EU schools.	
	The idea is to reduce number of classes for nursery/P1 for the particular sections (e.g. currently CZ section has 2 nursery classes can be reduced to 1 class in case that there is not enough priority enrolments for 2 classes)	
	New limit set for the nursery and primary students – 20 pupils.	
	Minimum number of pupils for Berkendael – 7 pupils, classes can be mixed (P1+P2, P3+P4) - new idea for Berkendael not used currently.	
	Overall effect could be large - expected reduction is around 100 pupils in nursery for Ixelles.	
	Group de Suivi on 25/10/2017 will discuss Impact Assessment for the use of future Brussels schools (including 5 th school).	
	It seems that this proposal is feasible to be supported by the Board of Governors (BoG). However, there is still risk that the BoG will kill the proposal as more seconded teachers will be needed from the MS.	
	As per the latest estimates – Berkendael (with the capacity for 1000 pupils) might have classes from 11 differerent sections. This appears to be rather "bricolage" exercise by the Central Enrolment Authority.
